

Local author, Robin Mary Allen, proudly announces the publication of her first novel, The House on Godwit. The novel fits in the sub-genre of Magical Realism, and the chapters alternate between 1915 and 1995. The story follows Diamond, the 40 year old

protagonist, as she tries to find her way in both time periods. The story is set in a fictional town which is an amalgam of Ayrshire and Curlew, renamed Godwit after the original name of Ayrshire. (The town petitioned to change its name from the suggested Godwit to Ayrshire in the early 1980s.) A plot paradox sustains to



the novel's end, holding the reader rapt in mystery.

Ms. Allen lives and writes in Ayrshire alongside her three dogs. She is working on her second novel, *Crow's Nest*. At age 64, she is thrilled to have finally

published her first novel, and is hoping to live long enough to publish her second, and a third novel, as well.

In Trunks, Hands, and Hearts: What Immigrants Bring to Iowa

The Pocahontas County Historical Society, along with the Rolfe, Laurens and Pocahontas Public Libraries, invite you to explore and celebrate immigration to Iowa in a display "In Trunks, Hands and Hearts: What Immigrants Bring to Iowa."

The exhibit, consisting of eight banners, explores immigration through objects, skills and traditions that were brought by immigrants. Thirteen museums and organizations shared stories, artifacts and historic photos for this display. One story comes from Pocahontas County. Amanda Kärf left Sweden in 1883 to join her older sisters in Iowa. Although she managed the sea voyage, her real difficulty began when she made her way to Pocahontas County. Amanda didn't speak English and had trouble locating her sisters in Fort Dodge.

The exhibit was created by the Vesterheim Norwegian-American exhibit in Decorah, Iowa and is sponsored by Humanities Iowa, the National Endowment for the Humanities and Edwin R, and Joan T. Hemphill.

This traveling banner display will be shown at the Rolfe Library from July 2-7, the Laurens Library from July 9-14 and the Pocahontas Library from July 16-21. In addition, a program by Laurann Gilbertson, curator of the Vesterheim Museum, will be held at the Laurens Public Library on Friday July 13 at 7 pm.



O'Brien Umpires & Campaigns

Candidate John O'Brien brought his campaign to Laurens June 18 in an unusual way—he umpired a ball game. After the game, he also stopped at the Rally Point bar downtown.

O'Brien is running for state senate in a district that covers all of Pocahontas, Calhoun, and Humboldt counties as well as most of Webster county. He is a school principal at the Rabiner campus of Manson-Northwest Webster. He lives in Ft. Dodge.

O'Brien is a one-time iron worker who has been umpiring for thirty years. He earned a history degree from Creighton University in Omaha and began teaching at Oakland-Riverside in 1997.

In a statement at his Facebook page O'Brien said, "To all those who have lost negotiation rights, correctional officers, teachers (thus all educators), firefighters, county employees, just to name a few, I've got your back.." He also endorsed the views of former Governor Robert Ray who said he wanted "harmonious and cooperative relationships between government and its employees by permitting public employees to organize and bargain collectively."
