

Strategic Considerations for Choosing a Corn Silage Hybrid

Reviewing guidelines for selecting an ideal corn silage hybrid is the focus of a June 21 webinar with the dairy team from Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. The program will be presented from noon to 1 p.m. by Adam Krull, a dairy veterinarian and nutritionist currently working for Pioneer.

"Adam will emphasize the significance of basic agronomic traits in ensuring yield stability, as well as a focus on dry matter and starch yield," said Fred Hall, dairy specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach.

Additionally, the presentation will underscore the crucial role of growing conditions in influencing fiber digestibility, discouraging the selection of corn silage hybrids solely based on their genetic potential for high digestibility. It will highlight that prioritizing kernel processing to enhance silage quality is more important than solely focusing on a hybrid's genetics related to starch digestibility.

Adam Krull is a dairy veterinarian and nutritionist currently working for Pioneer, where he provides technical support to dairy producers, optimizing forage production, harvest, storage and preservation to enhance animal productivity and health.

Trained at Iowa State with expertise in dairy science, veterinary medicine, and veterinary microbiology, he brings extensive experience as a general dairy practitioner and former clinical assistant professor at the Iowa State University College of Veterinary Medicine. Krull's passion extends to his hobby farm, where he and his wife Amanda raise a herd of registered black Angus cattle.

Northern Research Farm to Hold June Field Day

The Iowa State University Northern Research and Demonstration Farm will host a summer field day on Thursday, June 22, at the north farm, located at 310 S. Main St., Kanawha. This field day is being hosted by the Northern Research Farm, ISU Extension and Outreach and the North Central Iowa Research Association.

The day will begin with comments from Jason Henderson, vice president for Iowa State University Extension and Outreach; and Jay Harmon, associate dean in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and director for Agriculture and Natural Resources with ISU Extension and Outreach.

Matt Schnabel, farm superintendent, will provide a summary of farm activities, and Andy Christensen, vice president of the North Central Iowa Research Association, will provide an update on the capital campaign. Field tours will include the following:

Antonio Mallarino, professor in agronomy and extension specialist at Iowa State, will discuss the recently updated phosphorus and potassium recommendations.

Lee Burras, Morrill Professor in agronomy at Iowa State, will demonstrate soil impacts on crop production via an open soil pit. Mark Licht, associate professor in agronomy and cropping systems specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach, will discuss yields from the long-term tillage trials.

Registration and refreshments will start at 8:30 a.m. and the field day begins at 9 a.m. Lunch will be provided. There is no cost to attend and the meeting is open to the public.

Northwest Iowa Dairy Fitting & Showmanship Workshop Set For June 10

Dairy youth in the I-29 corridor who are interested in sharpening their fitting and showing skills are invited to a workshop on Saturday, June 10 from 9 am to 3 pm, which includes lunch plus a time for one-on-one time for questions and the opportunity to clip. The event will be held at the Dykshorn dairy located at 4149 Elmwood Ave, Ireton, IA 51027.

Local fitters and showmen will share their knowledge. Presenters include: Nathan Johnson, Brian Rozeboom, Adam Hansmann, Kaylea Hansmann, Natalie Hasse plus Paul and Stephanie Dykshorn.

The day will be divided into four stations which will include: washing and show prep basics, clipping the full body, clipping the topline and belly plus showmanship in the ring.

Paul Dykshorn will demonstrate and discuss washing and keeping your animal clean plus getting the right "fill" before walking into the ring.

Adam Hansmann and Brian Rozeboom will demonstrate full body clipping while Nathan Johnson will demonstrate and discuss how to blow up toplines and bellies and clipping them to best enhance your animal.

Finally, Kaylea Hansmann and Natalie Hasse will demonstrate how to break and then show your animal in the ring.

For those who want the extra one-on-one time at the end of the day, the fitters will help guide students through the process as they handle the clipper.

While the program is designed for youth, moms and dads are invited to attend so they can assist their kids when they get home. While there is no fee to attend, registration is required to insure adequate materials and meals.

Trainings to Certify or Renew Beef Quality Assurance

Iowa State University Extension and Outreach is offering June trainings to help beef producers become Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) certified or renew their current certification.

BQA is a national program featuring best management practices that align with the highest standards.

"Consumers are interested in the taste, freshness, price, and safety of the beef they eat," said Beth Doran, Extension beef specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach. "BQA focuses on beef quality and safety, animal welfare and environmental stewardship. The program is win-win – high quality beef for the consumer and increased beef demand which helps producers stay in business."

Doran said that two BQA trainings will be held in northwest Iowa:
