Dean A. Olson, age 94, of Dubuque, passed away peacefully at 11:25 p.m., on Friday, January 5, 2024, at Stonehill Health Center. To honor Dean's life there will be a Celebration of His Life held at a later date. Behr Funeral Home, 1491 Main Street is assisting Dean's family.

Dean was born on July 28, 1929, in Park Rapids, Minnesota, son of C. Axel and Pearl (Sutliff) Olson.

The family moved to Marathon, Iowa in 1945. He graduated from the North Central School of Agriculture (University of Minnesota) in 1949. Dean honorably served his country

with the U.S. Navy during the Korean War as a baker on the troop transport USS Rockbridge. After his return, he began farming part time for a number of years in Marathon while working at the Farmer's Coop and doing construction. He was lastly employed at Wilson Foods in Cherokee, Iowa from 1966, until his well earned retirement in 1991. He was united in marriage to Lois Beck in 1957, and they had 3 sons together before parting ways. Dean later married Dorothy Bell in 1986,

but she would sadly pass away in 2011. Dean was very devoted to his Methodist faith and The American Legion, always joining the local church and chapter no matter what town he was living in. He liked being active and was an avid BMW motorcycle rider in his 40's and 50's. He was also a talented wood worker and has created several beautiful pieces throughout the years. In his later years, Dean enjoyed gardening

and doing volunteer work. He had an agreeable personality and was always willing to help out when asked. Dean has lived a very full life and has seen countless changes throughout the years. He will be deeply missed.

Private Pesticide Continuing Instruction Course

Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Pocahontas County will be offering Private Pesticide Applicator Continuing Instruction Course (P-CIC), led by Extension Field Agronomist, Gentry Sorenson. The course will be offered on February 7, 2024 at 9:30 am at the Rialto Theatre in Pocahontas. Walk-ins on the day of the program will be allowed. Please pre-register at the Pocahontas County office with payment.

The course will run for approximately 2 ½ hours including check-in and breaks. The registration fee is \$30. To obtain additional information about the P-CIC, contact Pocahontas County Extension at 712-335-3103.

The course will fulfill 2023-2024 recertification requirements for private pesticide applicators. Topics to be covered include:

- Application equipment use, maintenance, and calibration
- Safe application techniques and pesticide drift reduction
- Pests, pest management, and pesticides

Annual Shade Tree Short Course to Return in February

Valuable resource for arborists, industry professionals, students and educators

The Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Shade Tree Short Course will be held Feb. 21-22 at the Scheman Building on Iowa State's campus. This is the 68th year for the course, which began in the mid 1950s and has grown to become one of the most popular and well-attended tree care conferences of its kind in the country.

This year, course organizers have assembled a diverse and highly relevant array of topics and speakers to satisfy the educational needs of arborists, nursery and landscape professionals, government officials, educators and students.

"The speakers are recruited from all regions of the country and generally recognized as leading experts in their particular field or discipline," said Jeff Iles, professor in horticulture at Iowa State.

The event will welcome back John Ball, South Dakota State University, and Guy Sternberg ("Mr. Oak") to the general session stage. Workshop sessions will include topics such as tree appraisal and the new USDA Hardiness Zone Map, tree grafting and much more.

Insect lovers can enjoy sessions on the periodical cicada, scale insects and spongy moth. Suzanne Wainwright-Evans will speak about the beneficial insects that help trees and how to preserve them.

The conference will also feature safety sessions including handling loads and pesticides on trailers, what to do if equipment gets caught in powerlines, and how to handle angry homeowners and customers.

Originally the brainchild of the late Harold (Sande) McNabb, forest pathologist and professor of plant pathology and forestry at Iowa State, the impetus and major reason for the meeting was to discuss the most significant biotic stressor of the day, Dutch elm disease.

In addition to the educational value participants receive at the course, they also can earn valuable continuing education credits. For pesticide applicators, the event offers courses that qualify for Pesticide Applicator CICs (continuing instruction courses). Arborists and tree care workers will find many opportunities to earn International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) CEUs.

Again this year, the STSC is partnering with the Iowa Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects to offer LA CES (landscape architecture continuing education system) approved courses.

Visit the STSC website to register. General registration on or before Feb. 9 is \$210, while registration after Feb. 9 is \$260. A discounted registration rate is available for Iowa State staff or full-time students.

Soil Fertility Workshop to be Held In Stanhope on February 7

Farmers wishing to maximize the profits from their fertilizer dollars will want to attend the soil fertility workshop hosted by Iowa State Extension Field Agronomist, Angie Rieck-Hinz, and the Iowa State Extension and Outreach Hamilton and Webster County Extension Offices. This workshop will address the profitable management of soil fertility in Iowa as conditions continue to change with increased fertilizer input costs, lower crop prices, and an increasing demand for nutrients from higher-yielding crops.

"This workshop will lead farmers through the basics of soil testing, analytical tests, calculating crop nutrient removal, understanding return on investment from fertilizer applications, how crop response correlates to soil test levels and what is known about crop response to micronutrients," says Angie Rieck-Hinz, field agronomist with ISU Extension.

The workshop is designed to help farmers understand their current soil nutrient situation, the amount their crops are using in a growing season and what needs to be added. Participants are encouraged to bring their own soil tests.

This workshop will be offered on February 7, from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., at the Stanhope Community Center located at 600 Main St. Space is limited, and pre-registration by Feb. 5th is required. Registration is \$45, and includes publications, copies of presentations refreshments and lunch. Certified Crop Advisers can obtain 3.5 Nutrient Management credits. Upcoming Parenting Workshops Offered Online from The Science of Parenting

Research conducted by Zero to Three (2016), found that parents need and want information and support. 80% of parents work to be better parents, and 69% of parents say if they knew more parenting strategies, they would use them. Despite this motivation, however, almost half of parents say they aren't getting the support they need during times of stress.

The Science of Parenting team from Iowa State University has scheduled online workshops to help parents learn strategies to use. The four workshops being offered in November are Understanding Research and Reality, Understanding Temperament, Children's Ages and Parenting Stages, and Positive Discipline. These workshops all focus on the objective of sharing research-based information that fits each family's own reality. In the first workshop, you'll learn how we can connect what research is telling us about parenting to our everyday lives. The second workshop is all about temperament – or the unique traits we all have and how to navigate them! The third helps parents and caregivers better understand child development. The fourth addresses the common question of "how do I practice positive discipline and manage my child's behavior?".

Understanding Research and Reality will be on Thursday, February 8th online from noon to 1:00 p.m. Registration is online at https://go.iastate.edu/2K4XRF.This workshop is approved for foster parent credit hours.
