

# **LAURENS TRADITION**

Memorial Day Program Set at Cemetery By RICK DAVIS

During a professional singersongwriter career devoted to meshing words and music on paper, Lee Greenwood's singular highlight has been that flag-waving ode "God Bless the USA."

Over time, it has remained his signature song, after being released by his record label 40 years ago,

The loyalist-steeped ballad includes a bridging chorus that sends a clear reminder to every American on every Memorial Day.

"And I'm proud to be an American, where at least I know I'm free. And I won't forget the men who died, who gave that right to me."

A powerful refrain is what it is. And one certain to ring true for many in attendance Monday morning at the Town Cemetery in Laurens when the community adds another chapter to one of the town's most endearing traditions -- the Memorial Day program that honors the hundreds of deceased military veterans who were Laurens

residents at some point in their lives.

This year's program begins at 9 a.m. at the flagpole area of the cemetery and a recorded version of Greenwood's "God Bless the USA" will be included in the musical segment.

Looked at on a broader scale, the Laurens program -- which was first held 130 years ago in 1894-represents the local version of that national holiday that originated back during the Civil War when it was called Decoration Day. "Decoration Day" was so-named initially because of the practice of decorating (with wreaths, flags and flowers) the graves of Union military service members who had died during the great struggle that pitted the North against the South.

After that, across the first half of the 20th Century, the day of remembrance evolved into "Memorial Day." Finally, it became an official national holiday in 1967 when duly annointed by federal legislation. Memorial Day today honors all American men and women who died while serving in the U.S. armed services.

As for Laurens, limited research indicates the community has held a Memorial Day program most every

year since 1894 -- except possibly for some years during World War I and World War II when wartime commitments may have taken precedence.

For the upcoming program on Monday, one of the most anticipated segments will be the reading of the names of more than 680 deceased military veterans who were Laurens residents at some point in their lives. Patricia Bailey, the wife of local VFW post 3533 commander Lee Bailey, will deliver the reading as a solemn tribute likely to stir a lot of memories.

This year's keynote speaker will be Laurens native Samantha Fuchs Cole, a teacher in the Iowa public schools system. Her local tie-in: she's a Laurens native and a 2006 graduate of Laurens-Marathon High School.

Again for this year's program, an added feature will be an avenue of flags display at both the Town Cemetery and the Catholic Cemetery, from Saturday morning through Monday evening.

Monday's program lead-in will be presentation of the colors by a color guard and veterans squad from the local VFW post, marching in formation from the cemetery's south end to the flagpole area.

NOTE: Program officials indicated the backup venue -- in the event of inclement weather -- will be the Old Gym at the Laurens-Marathon School, with the same 9 a.m. starting time.

\*\*21-gun salute by the rifle squad from VFW post 3533.

\*\*Playing of "Taps" by Laurens native Emily Harrold.

\*\*Retire the colors by color guard and VFW squad.

# Fairfield Township Cemetery Tour

To celebrate the 125th birthday of Albert City the committee is giving a cemetery tour at the Fairfield Township Cemetery on June 15th from 1:00 until 4:00 pm. You can drive out to the cemetery located about one mile west of Albert City where there is plenty of parking, or you can hop on the bus at the AC-T School.

Did you know there is a Bank Robber buried in this cemetery? Albert City was famous for foiling the escape of three bank robbers who robbed a bank up north. They rode to the Albert City depot where they were met by a posse of men, the Sherriff and deputies.

The early settlement of Albert City will be described, and you will also learn who the town is named after, and how she arrived in northwest Iowa. There will be a man who was interested in labor saving devices, so he and his brothers manufactured many products.

You will learn of the son of Swedish Immigrants who became one the largest employers in the area during WWII and what they made, and also how a farm implement business started in Albert City.

Explore the cemetery and find out about all kinds of history by riding a trolley on June 15, 2024. Just park east of the Cemetery off of C-29. A four-wheeler will pick you up, if necessary, and take you to the Trolley. Or you can take the bus from the AC-T School.

## Laurens-Marathon Schools Summer Food Service Program

Laurens-Marathon Community School is participating in the Summer Food Service Program.
